An update was given on Twin Lakes. They received No Smoking signs from the Tobacco Free Coalition and have received the donation box and will be installing it soon. They may try to get some fish stocked in the lake.

Representatives from Northern Dutchess Paramedics gave an update on their reaching out to residents for the 911 signage. 5 have bought signs since they started delivering the brochures, they also noticed there was no town road sign at the intersection at Black bridge and Deer haven, North Shore drive is too narrow for emergency vehicles, and there were two #475 church rd signs.

The summer youth program has been dealing with the extreme heat this season and has had to close early a few times. They had almost 100 signed up plus a waiting list.

The project with G-tel for cable and internet service within the town is at a standstill right now, they are waiting for National Grid to do some pole work. They are still working towards some activation within the town by the end of the year.

Councilperson Shumsky commented that on the North entrance to the village that shrubs are overtaking the town signage, and they need to be trimmed back. They will have the town groundskeeper look into it.
