- 3. Whether the request area variance is substantial. NO minimal.
- 4. Whether the proposed variance will have an adverse effect or impact in the physical or environmental conditions of the neighborhood or district. NO adverse.
- 5. Whether the alleged difficulty was self-created, which consideration shall be relevant to the granting of the area variance? Yes.

A motion to grant the 2.5 foot variance as presented was made by Charles Dickens and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Stan Yarian. All present voted AYE. Area Variance granted.

There being no further business before the Board, a motion to adjourn was made by Robert Fleming and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Charles Dickens. All voted AYE. Motion passed unanimously.
