### Section 1. LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY.

Pursuant to the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law § 1660 the Town of Livingston is enabled to regulate, prohibit, restrict or limit the parking of vehicles upon public highways maintained by the Town within Town limits. The Town Board of the Town of Livingston herein find it necessary to enact parking regulations for North Shore Drive and Parker Road to improve the orderly flow of traffic and pedestrians for the health, safety and welfare of residents.

### Section 2. ENACTMENT

### North Shore Drive Parking Prohibition

A. The Town Board of the Town of Livingston has determined that parking of vehicles shall be prohibited on North Shore Drive from May 15<sup>th</sup> to September 15<sup>th</sup> of each year.

### Parker Road Parking Prohibition

B. The Town Board of the Town of Livingston has determined that parking of vehicles shall be prohibited on Parker Road from May 15<sup>th</sup> to September 15<sup>th</sup> of each year.

### Exception for local deliveries

C. Notwithstanding the above, parking shall be permitted only for the limited purposes of local deliveries to any property that is adjacent to North Shore Drive and Parker Road. Parking for local deliveries shall be done in such a manner so as not to obstruct or interfere with the flow of traffic and persons and shall be limited to a period of 30 minutes maximum.

#### Enforcement.

D. Any violation of this article shall be enforced in accordance with the provisions of New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law.

### Section 3. VALIDITY AND SEVERABILITY.

If any section or part of this local law is declared invalid or unconstitutional, it shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force or effect of any other section of this local law.

### Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall be effective in accordance with the applicable law after filing with the Secretary of State.
