- Meeting started with the Pledge of Allegiance at 19:00.
- Roll call at 19:01.
- Reading of the July meeting minutes by Kyle Nilan. Motion to accept the minutes was made by Sarah Price, second by Bradley Papp
- All in favor; motion accepted.
- Jason Munz opened the meeting to Dana Gentile at 19:17.
- Jason Munz asked for a motion to open the public hearing for Darlin Doe Farm. A motion was made by Sarah Price, second by Bradley Papp.
- Jason Munz opened the public hearing to public comment.
- Olga Dekalo, a neighbor to Darlin Doe Farm Clarified that she has no objections to the content of this meeting, and had made no complaints about the Farm's program.
- Dana Gentile said the town needs to come up with a definition for a day camp, if the state requires three hours of business a day to be considered a daycare, then perhaps the same could be used for a day camp. Gentile said she will stop the day program entirely if needed.
- Jason Munz said he thinks it would be unfortunate if Dana Gentile didn't go through with special use permit process.
- Dana Gentile said she's worried about going through the Department of Health because potential issues might arise.
- Jason Munz suggested it's worth it to investigate the potential.
- Dana Gentile asked if she calls it something different will she still need a special use permit?
- Jason Munz said yes because the board is aware of the presence an nature of the program.
- Dana Gentile said she has liability insurance. Jason Munz said that's something the board will ask to see.
- Chris Roberts, Dana Gentile's husband said they are approaching the program as an accessory to the farm, as a way to help make money for the farm business.
- Chris Roberts and Dana Gentile are growing vegetables and raising meat and trying to sell that.
- Chris Roberts said the as an accessory to the farm, the program falls under the Right to Farm Act and sees this as a financial supplement.

- Michael Robbins, a next door neighbor said that the difference is that the program is for children and is not farming.
- Patrick Groenewoud, a neighbor who has sent his child to Darlin Doe Farm said he just came from Kesicke Farm where his child was celebrating a kids birthday. He described lots of kids running around and said that farm business is making lot of capital, profiting off the kids presence.
- Bradley Papp asked if they have special use permit.
- Peter Kreig, a neighbor, asked where the kids go to the bathroom.
- Bradley Papp said no one on the board is upset with what Darlin Doe are doing, they're simply laying the groundwork because this concept is unexplored in local law. The permit is for the town's liability.
- Patrick Groenewoud said his kids were at Darlin Doe and he never felt unsafe for his kids.
- Michael Robbins said he also sent his kid there and never felt unsafe. He sees this as an investment in the farm's future.
- Dana Gentile said its not about the money, but it opens up other things.
- Dana Gentile asked why the town would be responsible and said that the farm has special event insurance.
- Jason Munz asked if there were any more comments and asked for a motion to close the public hearing. A motion to close the public hearing was made by Sarah Price, second by Bradley Papp.
- Jason Munz asked for a motion to vote on the resolution. A motion to vote on the resolution was made by Bradley Papp, second by Sarah Price.
